Opportunities and Requirements for WISH Service Learning

Service learning means giving back to the community with one's time and acquiring new knowledge, wisdom, and/or skills through the process.

- Community service usually involves volunteering with a non-profit organization. All of the opportunities listed in this flyer are great options.
- Asking "Is there any other way I can be of help?" if you've finished a task and don't know what else to do



- Being respectful of everyone present.
- Listening carefully to instructions.
- Talking to friends and other people when appropriate, but not letting that get in the way of one's work.

What community service is **not**:

- Community service is not showing up to a volunteer opportunity and being more of an inconvenience than a help. What this would look like:
 - Not working hard (i.e. just staring into space or messing around with friends most of the time).
 - Not listening to directions from the people in charge.
 - Getting in the way of other people doing their jobs.
 - Helping your family by mowing the lawn, taking out the trash, etc. (though those are still great things to do!) do not count. Community service benefits the larger community beyond one's family and current friends.

If you're having trouble finding a way to fulfill your service hours, try:

- Asking a friend where they plan to volunteer and see if whoever is driving him/her can pick you up and take you there as well.
- Speaking to your English teacher.

Requirements

Students must complete the following number of hours for culmination. Hours can be completed during the summer prior to the school year and will be due during the 3rd quarter.

6th graders - 5 hours / 7th graders - 10 hours / 8th graders - 15 hours

At the end of the service learning quarter, students complete a writing assignment based on their experience.

Gardening

Emerson Community Garden Volunteer Days:

• Description: Members of the Westchester community help maintain this garden on the first Saturday of each month from 9am to 12pm (RSVP not required). Recent activities have included painting, weeding, and installing a storage system. Tending one's own garden plot there does not count as community service.

- Adult Required: Minors must have a waiver signed by an adult before volunteering here, but an adult does not necessarily need to stay with them throughout the volunteering process.

Community Garden at Holy Nativity:

- Description: Every Thursday from 4:15 to sunset (or an hour afterwards in the winter), volunteers help grow fresh fruits and vegetables for the LAX Food Pantry. Though the garden is located on the grounds of a church, it is not connected to any kind of religious activity. The supervisors of this garden can only accommodate about 3 middle-school volunteers at a time, so please email legacyla@gmail.com and holynativity@sbcglobal.net to confirm that they have openings available and will indeed be meeting on the day you wish to help.

- Minimum Age: None.

Habitat Restoration

Friends of the Ballona Wetlands:

- Description: From 9:30am to noon on the fourth Saturday of every month, volunteers help keep the Ballona Wetlands a place where native plants and animals can thrive. Projects include removing invasive species and trash as well as caring for native plants.

- Adult Required: Volunteers under the age of 15 must be accompanied by an adult.

- Description: This Foundation hosts a variety of volunteer events to help keep aquatic ecosystems around the Santa Monica Bay healthy, thus helping the plants, animals, and people who depend on the services the Bay provides. Events have included removing invasive species at UCLA's Stone Creek, caring for native plants at the Culver City Rain Garden and in Playa del Rey, and more.
