


# Our Philosophy and Mission


#### **GATE for ALL**

GATE researchers often emphasize the importance of all students learning together and getting access to high quality instruction from the outset! We agree and as a research practice site- ALL students get access to experiences and instructional practices designed for gifted students! All teachers are trained in GATE for ALL!

- TIER 1: GATE supports included novelty, acceleration, depth, and complexity in instructional experiences; intensive in school field trips (Walkthroughs); overnight field trips; greater adult to student ratio
- TIER 2: Intensive Workshop Time- students are planked across a grade level, for four 30-45 blocks per week to work on a projects and activities link to a specific area passion/need
- TIER 3: Individual students who are identified as being GATE have a 1:1 plan with goals developed with teachers and parents each year






